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Introduction

"DIE kleine BERLIN-STATISTIK
2009" (statistics for the City of
Berlin, 2009, key facts and figures)
offers information on the development of the German capital based
on the most important statistical
results.

This document is divided into chapters on different topics. Chapters 1–27 present figures on the city's demographic, economical, social, cultural and political structures. As far as possible, developments have been highlighted by including the figures for the years 2000, 2004 and 2008. The document also contains information on the city's boroughs (Chapter 28), data on Berlin's development since 1871 (Chapter 29) and accumulated figures for the region of Berlin / Brandenburg (Chapter 30).

By the end of the year 2008, Berlin had a population of 3,431,700 inhabitants and, therefore, approx.

15,400 people (or 0.5 per cent) more than at the beginning of the year. The nation's capital registered a growth in its population for the fourth year in a row. The main reason for this increase in the population is a further increase in the number of immigrants, namely 15,300 people. As in 2007, there was a slight excess of 25 births over deaths (2006: 194 births).

At the end of 2008, there were 1.9 million flats in Berlin: 3,321 more than at the end of 2007. Most of these new flats were built in Pankow (621) and Lichtenberg (585).

17.77 million overnight stays and 7.91 million guests were registered in Berlin's hotels and guesthouses, once again surpassing the figures of the previous year and thereby breaking the record for the fifth time in a row. Berlin's hotels and guesthouses that have nine or more beds and the campsites offering holiday camping grounds reported 4.2 per cent more guests and 2.8 per cent more overnight stays than in 2007.

After being adjusted for price changes, Berlin experienced real economic growth of 1.6 per cent in 2008. A medium-term view of economic development after this has been adjusted for price changes shows that the State of Berlin has been developing steadily, if only slightly since the year 2005.





Updated age pyramid on 31 December 2008 by marital status






04 Households and Families




Death from respiratory system disease



Price index for the construction of new residential buildings Change on previous year





27.1 Elections




