Introduction



»**DIE kleine BERLIN-STATISTIK 2011**« (statistics for the City of Berlin, 2011, key facts and figures) offers information on the development of the German capital based on the most important statistical results.

This document is divided into chapters on different topics. Chapters 1 – 27 present figures on the city's demographic, economical, social, cultural and political structures. As far as possible, developments have been highlighted by comparing with the figures for the years 2002, 2006 and 2010. The document also contains information on the city's boroughs (Chapter 28), data on Berlin's development since 1871 (Chapter 29) and accumulated figures for the region of Berlin/Brandenburg (Chapter 30).

On December, 31, 2010 the surface of Berlin covered 892 km². Of it were allotted 626,8 km² to the settlement and traffic surfaces. The proportion of the settlement and traffic surfaces was 70,3 percent.

Berlin had at the end of 2010 3,460,725 inhabitants. In relation to the conditions of the yearly beginning that was 18,050 persons more. With it since the year 2005 the registered increase in the population continued to continue. At the end of 2010 457,806 foreigners living in Berlin.

At the end of 2010, there were 1.9 million dwellings in Berlin, 4,243 more than at the end of 2009. Most of these new dwellings were built in Pankow (1,446) and Friedrichshain-Kreuzberg (695).

With approximately 20.8 million overnight spent in accommodation establishments in Berlin as well as 9.1 million guests were once again surpassing the figures of the previous year and thereby breaking

the record for the eight time in a row. The accommodating establishments announced 9.5 percent more arrivals of guest and 10.2 percent more overnight accommodation than in the year 2009.

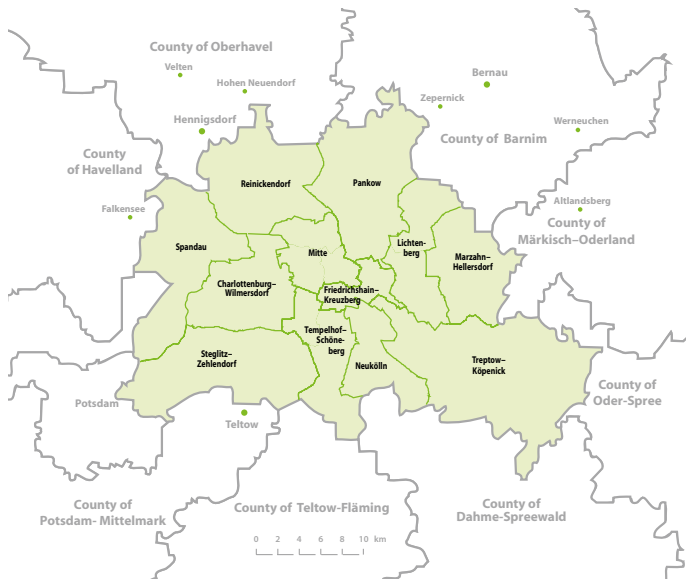
The national economic development in Berlin fell in 2010 from positive. In Berlin increased price-adjusted gross domestic product by 2.2 percent. The medium-term analysis of price-adjusted economic development shows that Berlin since 1991, steadily, if slightly upward developed, but only in 2009 had a setback.

In the year 2011 there were two large elections in Berlin. Besides the choice of the Berlin Chamber of Deputies (Berliner Abgeordnetenhaus) also found the elections to the Borough council Assemblies (Bezirksverordnetenversammlungen). The SPD with 28.3 percent of the second votes is the strongest party in Berlin, followed by the CDU with 23.3 percent and the party Grüne with 17.6 percent.

»DIE kleine BERLIN-STATISTIK 2011« gives an initial overview of the data provided by official statistics. A similar brochure has been published for the federal state of Brandenburg (»DIE kleine BRANDENBURG-STATISTIK 2011«). 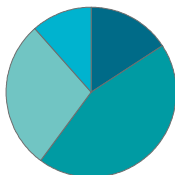

by age groups

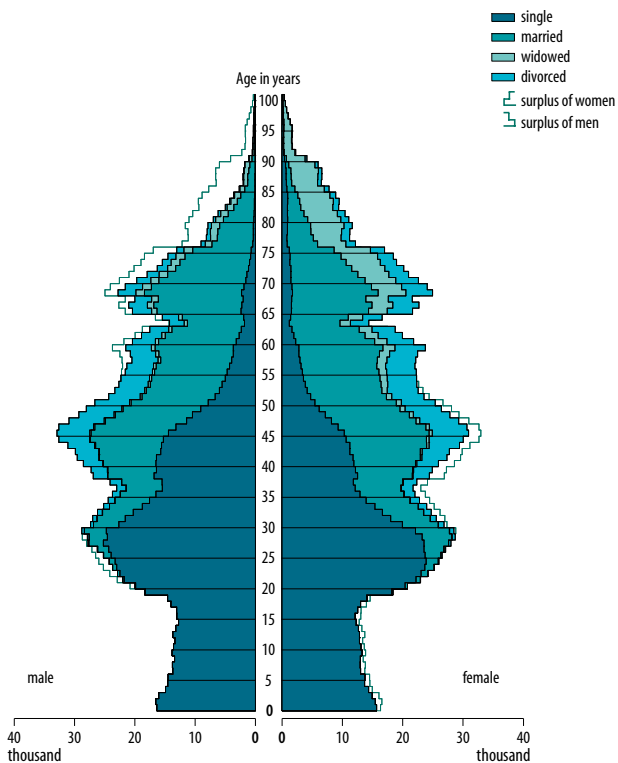

status

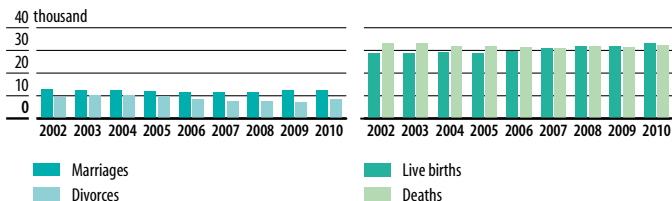

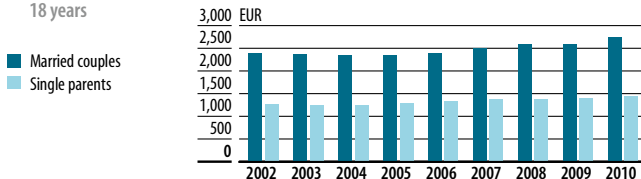
04 Households and Families

Average monthly net income of families with children under 18 years

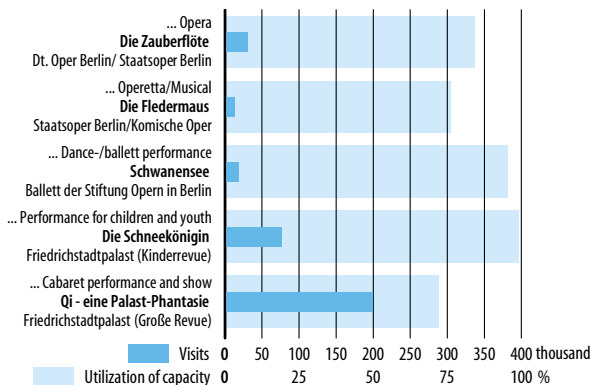

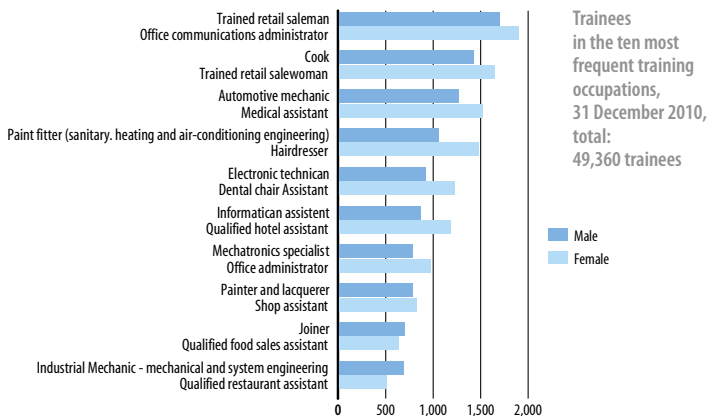

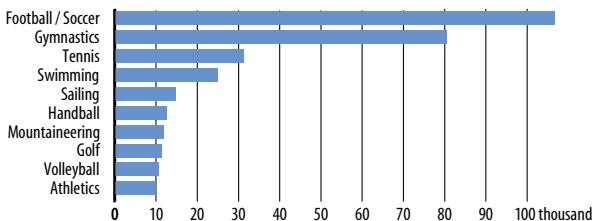

The ten most popular kinds of sports, by members of sports associations, 2010

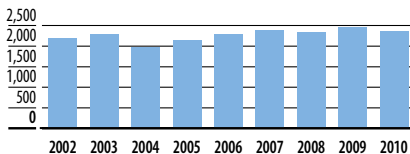

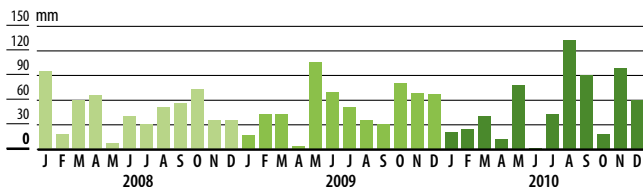

Investments for environmental protection of the enterprises of the mining industry and manufacturing



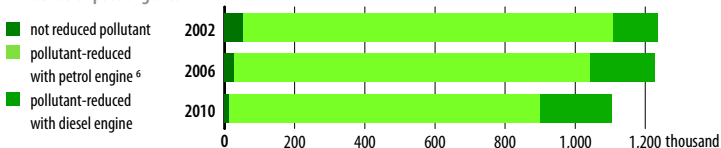

Existence of passenger car

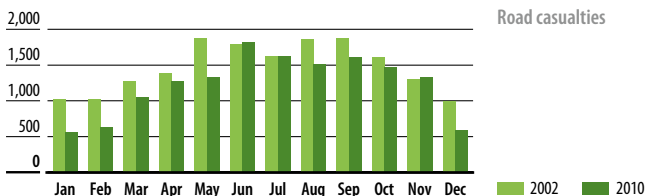

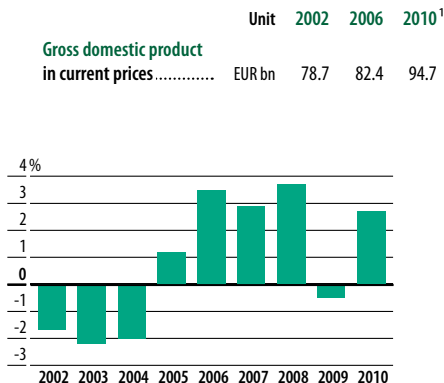

Gross domestic product price-adjusted % change on previous year



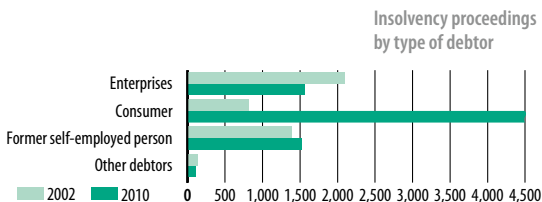

Turnover of the manufacturing

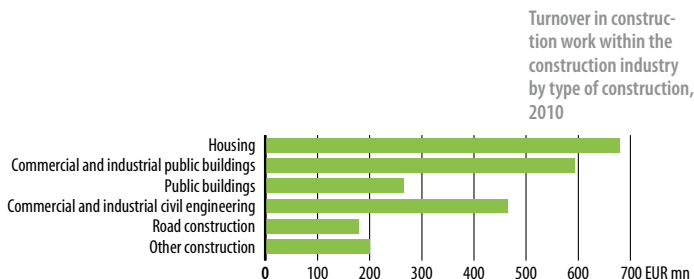

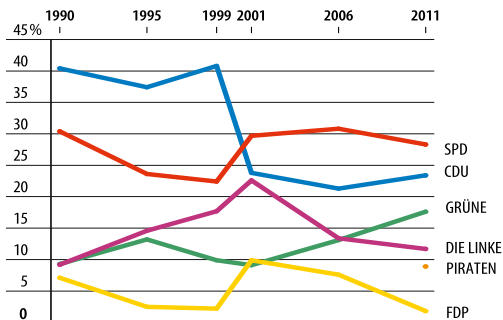

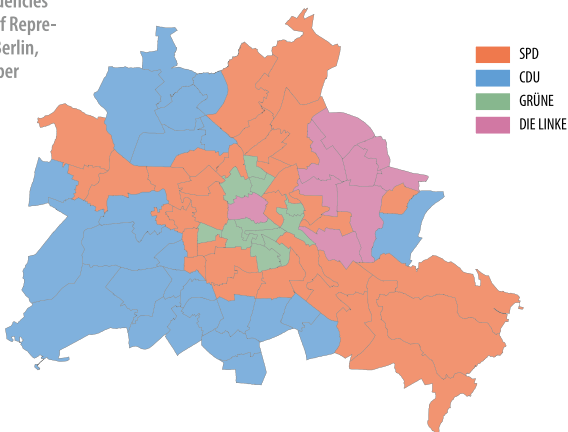

27.5 Elections

On 7 June 2009 the citizens of Berlin were able to directly participate in an election for the European Parliament (Europäisches Parlament) for the fourth time. In the case of the European elections which took place prior to German Reunification in 1979, 1984 and

1989 the Berlin representatives in the European Parliament were determined by the House of Representatives (Abgeordnetenhaus von Berlin) in accordance with the size of the respective parliamentary groups represented there.

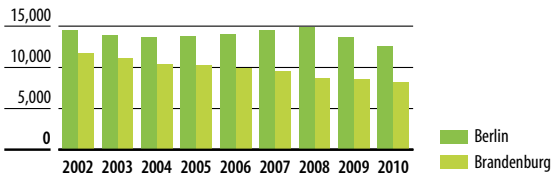
