Introduction

"DIE kleine BRANDENBURG-STATISTIK 2009" (statistics for the Land of Brandenburg, 2009, key facts and figures) offers information on the development in the Land of Brandenburg based on the most important statistical results.

This document is divided into chapters on different topics. Chapters 1-27 present figures on Brandenburg's demographic, economical, social, cultural and political structures. As far as possible, developments have been highlighted by including the figures for the vears 1999, 2003 and 2007. The document also contains information on the administrative districts (Chapter 28), data on Brandenburg's development since 1990 (Chapter 29) and accumulated fiaures for the region of Berlin / Brandenburg (Chapter 30).

18,808 births were registered, i.e. 219 more children were born than in the previous year. This shows a continuing increase in the birthrate, which already rose in 2007. The current birthrate is the highest that has been registered since the reunification of Germany. In 2008, 26,807 inhabitants of the State of Brandenburg died: 141 more than in 2007. This resulted in an increase in deaths over births of 7,999 people.

On balance, 5,300 people moved out of the state. Together with the increase in deaths over births, the State of Brandenburg lost about 13,200 people (just under 0.5 per cent of its population) during the course of the year 2008. At the end of 2008, the population came to approx. 2,522,500 people, making it he lowest that has been recorded in the official population statistics for the State of Brandenburg since the reunification of Germany.

10.17 million overnight stays and 3.73 million guests were registered in the state's hotels and guesthouses, once again surpassing the figures of the previous year. 2.8 per cent more guests and 2.4 per cent more overnight stays were reported than in 2007. As in the previous year, the average stay per quest amounted to 2.7 days.

After being adjusted for price changes, Brandenburg experienced real economic growth of 1.0 per cent.

In 2008, economic growth in Brandenburg was only half of that in 2007. In particular, the determining sector, namely manufacturing, suffered the highest drop.

"DIE kleine BRANDEN-BURG-STATISTIK 2009"

gives an initial overview of the data provided by official statistics. A brochure along the same lines has been published for the Land of Berlin ("DIE kleine BER-LIN-STATISTIK 2009").

Those interested also can find a similarly structured selection of figures and data for the Federal Republic of Germany as well as benchmark figures for all German "Länder" in "Key Data on Germany", published annually by the Federal Statistical Office




Updated age pyramid on 31 December 2008 by marital status





Information on the economic and social situation of the population is provided by the micro-census. This involves an official annually performed household survey which covers one percent of all households. These households are selected by means of a random mathematical procedure Interviewers provide information about the survey which is performed on location.



04 Households and Families

Every community of persons living together and forming an economical unit as well as persons who live alone and, nevertheless, manage for themselves are counted as a household (private household). A household may include relatives and persons who do not belong to the family as such (e.g. companions or partners in life). Married couples with children as well as single parents and unmarried couples with their unmarried children living in the same household are counted as families.







Death from respiratory system disease







The foreign trade statistics provide figures with regard to the movement of goods across the frontiers (import and export) between Brandenburg and foreign countries. The basis for the results is provided by the customs documents of importers and exporters in the trading industry with countries outside of the European Union (extra trade) as well as the statistical registrations of acquisitions and deliveries within the community within the meaning of the Value-Added Tax Law (intra trade).

23.1 Employment and Compensation of Employees

The number of employed persons along with their wages and salaries are determined within the scope of national account. The figures on the number of employed persons correspond to the workplace concept; that is, all employed persons who have their job in Brandenburg are taken into consideration. In the result for income creation the figure for employee earnings reflects all of the cash and non-cash benefits accrued to employees working in Berlin from work or other employment relationships.





Gross monthly earnings¹ of fully employed people² according to their occupation (cost centres) and gender in industry and service for 2008






