The brochure also contains information on the administrative districts (Chapter 27), data on Brandenburg's development since 1990 (Chapter 28) and figures on the region of Berlin-Brandenburg (Chapter 29).

The »**kleine brandenburg-statistik 2017**« gives an initial overview of the data provided by official statistics. A similar brochure is available for the federal state of Berlin »**kleine berlin-statistik 2017**«. Both booklets are also published in German language.



by age and marital status












Gross domestic product in prices-adjusted rate of change in percent



change on same month of previous year




