General note.

This chapter does not include:

- a) Parings and other similar waste of untanned hides or skins (Chapter 5);
- b) Birdskins and parts of birdskins with their feathers, unworked or simply preserved (Chapter 5) or prepared or mounted (Chapter 67);
- c) Raw hides or skins with their hair or fur (Chapt. 43). However, raw hides and skins, with their hair or fur, of bovine cattle (including buffalo), of equine animals or other solipeds, of swine (including peccary), of chamois, or reindeer, of elk or of deer, and of sheep or goats, except curled skins of lambs (socalled astrakhan or caracul /Persian, broadtail or the like/), skins of Indian lamb or skins of Mongolian, Tibet or Yemen goats or kids, fall within items 4101 11 to 4101 90;

- 3. Except where otherwise provided, articles covered with natural or artificial leather are deemed to be articles of natural or artificial leather, irrespective of the nature of the backing.
- 4. Unfinished or incomplete articles of a kind falling under this chapter are classed with the finished articles when they are recognisable as parts of such articles; otherwise they are classified according to their kind.

- b) As bleached woven fabrics: Woven fabrics bleached in the piece or woven from bleached yarn or from yarn to be treated as bleached yarn; Woven fabrics woven from unbleached and undischarged or bleached yarn or yarn to be treated as bleached varn; Discharged woven fabrics; Fabrics dyed white; c) As dyed woven fabrics: Woven fabrics dyed in the piece or woven from yarn dyed with a single colour and shade, excluding woven fabrics dyed white; Cream-coloured fabrics; d) As woven fabrics made of coloured yarn: Fabrics woven with yarns of different colours; Fabrics woven with yarns of different shades; Woven fabrics consisting of unbleached or bleached yarns together with coloured yarns; Woven fabrics of mixed dyed yarns.
- No account is to be taken of selvedges and ends in above cases; e) As printed woven fabrics: Woven fabrics printed in one or more colours or shades after weaving; Shadowy fabrics produced by a printed pattern on the warp before weaving; Fabrics woven from printed yarn, flake yarn or veined yarn; Fabrics woven from undischarged or unbleached, bleached or dyed yarn and printed yarn, flake yarn or veined yarn. The following are, futhermore, treated as printed. woven fabrics: Woven fabrics with painted, stencilled, sprayed or acidprinted patterns or with coloured patterns otherwise applied after weaving;

- h) As woven fabrics for furnishings and interior decorating: Textile materials for furniture covers, heavy draperies and curtains and table-covers of a weight exceeding two hundred and fifty grammes per square metre.
- 7. Moiré work, embossing and similar mechanical treatments after weaving do not affect the classification of woven fabrics.
- 8. Gimped yarn, braid yarn, crochet yarn and chenille yarn are classified under trimmings.
- 9. Goods of mixed textiles:
 - A. General definitions. Except where otherwise provided, textile goods containing two or more textiles are classified as follows:
 - a) Goods of mixed textiles in which the weight of silk, schappe or bourette (Chapter 50) amounts to more than 10 per cent of the total weight of the textiles are classed with goods of the same kind composed of these textiles; goods of mixed textiles containing two or more of those textiles are classified with such item of Chapter 50 that relates to the textile . fibre predominating in weight;
 - b) Goods of mixed textiles not falling under a) and whose warp consists wholly of artificial or synthetic filaments are deemed to be woven fabrics of artificial or synthetic filaments (Chapter 52);
 - c) Goods of mixed textiles other than those mentioned under a) and b) are classed with goods of the same kind consisting of the textile which predominates in weight;
 - d) If the conditions as set out under a) paragraph 2 and under c) apply and not only one of several textiles predominates in weight, or if all the textiles are of the same weight classification is determined by the textile which involves the highest rate of duty.

 - b) In such cases where the nature of uppers is the deciding factor classification is dependent on the material forming the vamp.  - c) Footwear, lined with furskin or artificial fur is regarded as footwear with uppers of furskin, irrespective of the material of which the upper is otherwise composed.

 - a) Articles made of rubberised textiles, manufactured of yarn with a rubber cover are classed with the rubber articles in this chapter, excluding the articles of rubberised textiles without such a cover;
