1 Environmental-Economic Accounting of the Federal Statistical Office

Environmental-Economic Accounting (EEA) describes the interrelationship between the economy and the environment. For its economic activities, production and consumption an economy not only uses labour and produced assets but also natural assets. Natural assets include raw materials such as sources of energy, ores, other minerals and water as well as land that serves as a location for production, consumption and various leisure activities. These parts of natural assets are used directly. Other components of natural assets are ecosystems and other natural systems such as the atmosphere. They support economic activities by absorbing and eliminating residues and pollutants arising from production and consumption, such as atmospheric emissions, waste and effluent.




Figure 1: Interrelationship economy environment

Figure 1 shows the interrelationship between economy¹ and environment. On the one hand natural assets are used as input for the economic process. On the other hand the economy discharges residues and pollutants.

The use of natural assets – similar to the produced capital stock – generally involves depletion, which means that the burden or **impact on the environment** causes changes in its state and/or natural assets. On the one hand, these changes are of a quantitative nature (e.g. a decreasing amount of non-renewable raw materials); on the other, they have many qualitative aspects (deteriorating air quality due to emissions of pollutants, diminished biodiversity etc.). Attempts are being made to prevent these negative changes with targeted, appropriate environmental protection measures, such as by avoiding environmental burden (e.g. desulphurising flue gas) or remedying damage that has already been done (e.g. cleaning up polluted sites). The interdependencies between the economy and the environment therefore are not restricted to showing the burdens on the environment; in fact the pattern also includes changes to the state of

the environment brought about by pollution and the steps taken to avoid it or repair the damage.

The EEA aims to describe all three forms of interdependence between economy and environment – environmental burden, the environmental state and environmental measures. The description of these interdependencies takes as its starting point the fact, mentioned above, that a national economy not only uses labour and capital but also nature. Therefore, the basic idea is to take the commonly accepted definition of a national economy and expand it by a "factor nature". The System of National Accounts (SNA) provides a comprehensive and systematic definition of economic activity. Principally, they show monetary transactions (flows) and assets using standardised classifications. EEA were conceived as a satellite system for the national accounts, the objective of which is to extend the presentation of the economic process by a depiction of the interrelationship between the economic system and the environment. The environmental flows and inventories are almost always presented in physical units. For example, air emissions are expressed in tonnes, energy consumption in Terajoules, area used for transport and settlement purposes (land use) in square metres.

An important feature is the full compatibility of both systems – the national accounts and the EEA. The underlying concepts, definitions, distinctions, and classifications in both systems match as far as this is logically sensible and possible. This also applies and particularly so for the economic classifications used in the EEA and the SNA. Because of these common concepts, definitions, distinctions and classifications the results of the EEA can be linked internally and to the identically categorised SNA data and they can be analysed jointly. Compatibility with the national accounts permits for example to relate the environmental parameters, which are mostly shown in physical units (such as in tonnes), to the economic indices (in euros). Of particular importance here are the data on the efficiency of environmental use, expressed as an arithmetical ratio of the figure of interest (such as raw materials consumption) to the gross value added (GVA) or to the gross domestic product (GDP). With regard to the details of calculating productivities and intensities see the notes on the tables in Part 1.


The concept underlying the EEA is to express the status quo and the change in natural assets in units of money, so as to be able to determine what is known as corrected macro-economic aggregates, such as the ecological domestic product. Particularly insofar as such evaluations do not assess the quantitative decrease of resources, but refer to qualitative changes of other components, they are problematic in many respects with regard to the methods used (valuation/aggregation problems, restricted knowledge about correlation between cause and effect and considerable regional differences). That is why such calculations tend not to be carried out by the Federal Statistical Office but by scientific research institutes. Consequently, when presenting environmental pollution and the state of the environment EEA of the Federal Statistical Office is restricted to physical data.

Environmental economic accounts and national accounts describe two dimensions of sustainable development— economy and environment— and their interrelationship. Therefore they provide an important and useful data base for political discussions concerning sustainability.

Figure 2 shows the different reporting **modules of the EEA** of the Federal Statistical Office. They reflect the internationally recognized pressure-state-response model, used to statistically show correlations between the environment and the economy. The **environmental pressures** reporting module shows the material flows listed behind it: the amount of raw materials extracted per year, the amount of pollutants emitted per year etc. This reporting module does not include produced goods or services, but raw materials extracted from nature and residual materials and hazardous substances emitted back into nature. The respective flows for each type of material are booked as

consolidated quantities, in what is known as the material account, which charts the flows of material between a national economy and both the natural environment and the world's other national economies.

At present, the **state of the environment** reporting module of the German EEA only expresses the component of the natural capital presented by land area. Especially land use by housing and transport are in the focus of this reporting module. Looking at how much land area is used by which economic stakeholder, however, can not be realised for the time being. Landscapes and ecosystems form yet another essential component of the natural capital, which should principally be included by accounting. In Germany these aspect are dealt with by Agency for Nature Protection, not by environmental economic accounts. Displaying the stocks of mineral resources — a third aspect of the natural assets, which may be of great importance for countries rich in raw materials — has a fairly low priority as far as German EEA is concerned and has so far not been considered. A reporting module has so far only been developed for forest.

In the module **environmental protective measures**, components already included in the monetary transactions of the national accounts are shown separately and, as a rule, broken down further. Here, for example, environmentally relevant taxes, such as vehicle tax or fuel tax, are shown. Another important part of environmental protective measures consist of investment and ongoing expenditure for environmental protection in the government and manufacturing industry sectors, as well as privatised public enterprises. Contrary to the physical electric power accounts of the material and energy flow accounts and the physical asset accounts describing the state of the environment, the EEA shows the environmental protective measures in the form of monetary accounts.

The **sectoral reporting modules**, presently used for the transport, agriculture, forestry, and private households sectors, enable extending the EEA standard programme by single items for politically significant topics. For such sectors, these reporting modules provide a much more detailed picture of the complete range of interdependencies between the environment and the economy, across the EEA components mentioned above.

1 Environmental-Economic Accounting of the Federal Statistical Office

Typical of EEA is considering the environmental impact (removing raw materials, land use, services of the environment) of economic activities from two angles: the first question is to what extent an environmental factor enters the economic cycle or is adversely affected in production or consumption of private households. Apart from this it is however also important to know what quantities of environmental factors are being employed and for what final purpose. This second assessment not only assigns directly consumed factor components to a specific category of use (such as the consumption activities of private households), but also those quantities needed to manufacture all the goods consumed by the households (at all stages of the production process) and therefore consumed, as it were, "indirectly" by the households. This contrasting of direct and indirect parameters is comparable with the presentation of origin and use in the national accounts, and applies to numerous subjects of EEA.

"Upstream" indirect consumption cannot be derived from the accounting system directly. Allocation takes place through a model approach based on input-output tables (IOT). IOTs are central elements of the national accounts; they include details of the upstream interdependencies between the individual production sectors, to name just one example.

The concept of Environmental Economic Accounts was established and further developed at **international level** by the United Nations, in particular, and adopted in February 2012 as an international statistical standard "System of Integrated Environmental and Economic Accounting (SEEA Central Framework 2012)"². In Germany substantial sections of the environmental economic accounts are drawn up based on these conceptual proposals in the SEEA.

Since the release of the tables in 2011 homogeneous branches (WZ 2008) are presented in a break down comparable to the statistical classification of economic activities of the European Community. Until 2010, the tables were calculated according the WZ 1993 respectively on the basis of the WZ 2003.

The intensities are shown in the tables 2011 only for the years from 2000 onwards, as data on gross value added by homogeneous branches after the revision of the national accounts are available only as from the reference year 2000.

Chapter 5 Raw materials

Raw materials are materials occurring in the environment in an unprocessed manner. Here all raw materials being extracted from the domestic environment to be used within the economy and all imported raw materials are presented. Unit used is tonnes. This information is supplemented by data about the imports and exports of semifinished and finished products. Sources are production and foreign trade statistics, the statistic on agriculture, forestry and fisheries, various association statistics as well as additional information from ministries, institutions and other authorities. If specific information is not originally available in tonnes, it is converted.

The table on raw material equivalents (RME) shows the volume of first input and the final use of raw materials within the economy. This is computed by tracing back all goods and services used for consumption, investment or export to those raw materials that were originally used to create them. The physical unit is tonnes of raw material equivalents (t RME). Domestic extraction of raw materials is by definition in raw material equivalents.

Chapter 6 Use of water

A variety of data sources are used to calculate the tables of water withdrawal from nature. The initial data for water withdrawal are taken largely from official statistics (statistics of water supply and waste water disposal in mining and manufacturing and with thermal power plants for public supply, as well as statistics of public water supply and waste water disposal), the last year under report of which was 2013. In order to close gaps in data (for instance in agriculture and services), further data from the official statistics are used as well as from other sources, such as publications of academic institutes, associations and organisations.

Chapter 7 Waste water

In the tables on waste water, the volumes of waste are determined by water withdrawal from nature. Both values differ largely by virtue of the items infiltration and rain water, evaporation and other losses.

Different data sources are used to calculate the tables of waste water. The initial data are largely taken from official statistics (statistics of water supply and waste water disposal in mining and manufacturing and with thermal power plants for public supply, as well as statistics of public water supply and waste water disposal), the latest year under report of which was 2013. In order to close data gaps (such as which agriculture and services), many other data are used from official, as well as from other sources, such as publications of academic institutes, associations and organisations.

Chapter 8 Waste

Waste includes all residues or other undesirable substances. It many be either solid or liquid (unless it is introduced into bodies of water and waste disposal installation) and pasty materials (all kind of mud) and collected gases. The survey also include waste to be recycled as well as waste for disposal. Information relating to waste volumes is always provided in tonnes. The evidence provided in the result tables is shown in 1,000 tonnes. The waste quantities are always wet-quantities of waste.

4 General notes

The basis for kinds of waste recorded from reporting year 2002 is the European Waste Catalogue (now List of Wastes) in accordance with the German Waste Catalogue Ordinance (Ordinance implementing the European Waste Catalogue of 10 December 2001 – Federal Law Gazette I, page 3379). The European List of Wastes is a waste catalogue harmonised throughout the European Union which regulary checked based on new findings and amended as necessary. It is subdivided into waste chapters, waste groups and waste categories. The different waste types are entirely defined through their codes (6-digits) and the chapters to whom they are belonging. For a precise detection, especially of the waste treatment outputs, a further specification by 8-digit codes can be undertaken. The waste classification used is primarily oriented towards waste sources (branches).

Waste balance sheet

Section 6 of the German Environmental Statistics Act (Umweltstatistikgesetz – *UstatG*) stipulates that the Federal Statistical Office (Destatis) shall produce annual surveys in the form of balance sheets representing the amount, recycling and disposal of waste in accordance with Sections 3 to 5 of the Act. Detailed statistics from waste survey are combined, using a computer model, to form the waste balance sheet. The calculation has been carried out from reporting year 2006 in accordance with the so-called gross volume principle². Based on the input of all registered waste disposal plants it summarises the waste volumes of any kind of waste generated domestically that is treated and disposed of. This is calculated from the input of the plants minus imports and plus exports. Waste flows subject to multiple treatments increase waste volumes to a certain extent. That is why re-treated waste that is already a product of one treatment is shown separately.

Chapter 9 Environmental protection measures

Environmental protection expenditure

In April 2014, the European regulation on environmental economic accounts has been extended to include a module³ on environmental protection expenditures. From the end of 2017 onwards it will be mandatory for all EU Member States to deliver national data on environmental protection expenditure starting with the reporting year 2014.

In 2010, the calculations have been revised and converted to meet the concepts and requirements of the EU Regulation. Compared to the past, data is based much stronger on the National Accounts. The expenditure on protection of the environment is much higher than in the past. Besides methodological change, this is due to the inclusion of more environmental areas and economic sectors, e. g. private companies of the waste water and waste management. Furthermore, changes occur due to the general revision⁴ of the National Accounts in 2014, so that data is not comparable to the previous concept.

In the course of the revision of the national accounts in 2014, new concepts and data bases were taken into account and calculation methods were modified (for more information see www.destatis.de/Revisionen).

4 General notes

The data used are results of input-output as well as domestic product calculation. Furthermore, data from the surveys on investments for environmental protection in industry and current expenditure for environmental protection in industry are used.

As the calculation of environmental protection expenditures is based on the concepts, definitions and delimitations of national accounts, the valuation principles as well as the presentation units and their summary to economic sectors are in line with those of the national accounts.

At this time, not all legal requirements could be implemented. Currently, current and capital transfers paid and received (e. g. subsidies) are not included. Furthermore, data for non-profit institutions serving households are not considered. Hence, data have to be considered as preliminary and will be adjusted as soon as data availability has improved.

Environmental taxes

The concept of statistics on environmental taxes was drafted at international level by the OECD and the Statistical Office of the European Communities (Eurostat). In doing so, a pragmatic approach was selected which exclusively uses the tax basis as a base. The relevant point is that the tax refers to a physical unit (or a proxy for this), which has a proven negative impact on the environment. In concrete terms this includes emissions in the widest sense (atmospheric emissions, waste water, waste, noise), energy products, fertilisers, pesticides and transport. At the same time, it was determined that value added tax, which is levied on energy products, motor vehicles, fertilisers and pesticides and the like is not counted among the environmental taxes.

For environmentally related tax revenues, revenues from the energy tax, electricity tax, vehicle tax, air traffic tax and nuclear fuel tax are summarized. In addition, the proceeds from the sale of emissions permits are included. They are based on the taxes' concepts of national accounts.

For the interpretation of the results tax rates, tax exemptions, and tax reductions are to be included. Hence, for instance reduced tax rates were decided for agriculture, production industries as well as for rail and local public transport. Combined heat and power production, as well as electricity from renewable energy sources, were exempted from the tax.

A table on environmental tax revenue by economic activities is included for the first time (Table 9.5).

Glossary

Raw materials

Abiotic raw materials

Abiotic raw materials are non-renewable raw materials. In contrast to the biotic raw materials, replicating in sustainable farming, once consumed abiotic materials is with a view to the livelihoods of future generations irretrievably lost. The collection of abiotic raw materials is carried out separately for used abiotic raw materials such as fuels, ores and other mineral resources including peat and by not used abiotic raw materials (lignite overburden, tailings of energy and mineral resources and soil extraction).

Biotic raw materials

Biotic raw materials are renewable, naturally occurring sustances of animal and vegetable origin. The biotic raw materials are recorded separately for used biotic raw materials such as crop products from agriculture, biomass for animal feed, biomass from forestry (wood) and animals (fishing and hunting route) and by non-usable biotic resources (not recycled biomass from agriculture (e. g. as straw, cover crops) and fisheries (bycatch). Bred animals are no raw materials in the context of these calculations and are therefore not included.

Exports (Special trade system)

Exports of goods and services - merchandise trade comprise goods leaving the statistical territory of a country. In the general trade system, the definition of the statistical territory of a country coincides with ist economic territory. In the special trade system, the definition of the statistical territory comprises only a particular part of the economic territory, mainly that part which coincides with the free circulation area for goods. The free circulation area is a part of the economic territory of a country within which goods may be disposed of without Customs restrictions.

Imports

Imports of goods and services (merchandise trade) are goods which add to the stock of material resources of a country by entering it is economic territory. It is accounted for direct importation of goods into free circulation of the destination country, all imports into stock (customs warehouse) at the time of it is incorporation, as well as inward and outward processing arrangements as a customs official authorized activity or by customs officials appropriated admission temporaire including mending. The special trade, representable for imports only to the Federal Republic of Germany, however, contains no imports in stock. Imports from warehouse for free circulation or inward processing are, however, included in the special trade.

Primary materials

In the material flow accounts the term primary materials comprises the material extracted from domestic environment and all imports regardless of their stage of manufacturing (raw materials, semi- and finished goods).

Raw materials

In Environmental-Economic Accounts (EEA) raw materials are those materials are those materials occuring unprocessed by humans in the natural environment.

Raw material equivalents

The raw material equivalents of imports and exports consist of all those material inputs that are needed in the production of traded goods (intermediate material consumption), plus the mass of the imports and exports themselves. RME are equivalent to all those raw materials that from the basis of an import or export, irrespective of the economy in which the resources are used in the production process.

Raw material productivity

Raw material productivity expresses how much gross domestic product (in euros, adjusted for price changes) is obtained per tonne of abiotic primary material. The (non-renewable) raw materials withdrawn from the domestic environment – not counting agricultural and forestry products – as well as all imported abiotic materials (raw materials, semi-finished and finished products) are considered to be abiotic primary material.

Used extraction of raw materials

The used extraction of raw materials is a position of the discharge side of the material flow accounts. It covers all abiotic and biotic raw materials which are taken from the domestic environment and enter into the production or consumption process of the economy or into export. These include fuels, ores and other mineral resources, plant biomass from agriculture, biomass from forestry (wood) and biomass of animals (sea and coastal fishing and hunting bag).

Unused domestic extraction

Unused Domestic Extraction includes all those materials that are extracted from the national environment but not used in the national economy, i.e.they remain in the

Examples are: unused material excavated during civil engineering work and construction, unused material extracted in mining, unused tree residues from felling or

unused parts of harvested crops.

Use of water / Waste water

Cooling water Cooling water or cooling waste water is water which is used to absorb or remove heat

from cooling processes. It is generally unpolluted.

Groundwater Groundwater is water that can usually recovered from an underground formation.

Infiltration Infiltration water is especially unwanted drainage into the sewage network.

Spring water Spring water is natural groundwater discharge.

Surface water Water which flows on the surface of a land mass, such as rivers, streams, lakes etc., as

well as artificial watercourses such as water reservoirs.

Treated waste water Waste water discharged from treatment plant. Treatment plants are urban waste water

treatment plants or industrial waste water treatment plants.

Waste water Waste water is used water, typically discarded into the sewage system. It contains matter

and bacteria in solution or suspension.

Waste water directly discharged Direct discharge of treated and untreated wastewater or unused water into surface water

or into ground water.

Waste water indirectly discharged Indirectly discharged wastewater is discharge of treated and untreated (including unused

water) water into the public sewage system.

Water discharged into nature Water discharged into nature includes direct and indirect water discharge of industries

and private households as well as water losses, evaporation and rain and infiltration

water.

Water use The use of water by industry and private households in a region arises from the water

> abstraction from nature, plus the water received from the public water sectors or other industries and the deliveries of unused water to other units. In addition to the actual used

water for production and consumption water use - according to the concept of

Environmental-Economic Accounting – includes infiltration and rain water, water losses and evaporation as well as the unused water. At the macroeconomic level, the difference between water use and the abstraction of water from nature is the balance of imports

and exports of water.

Withdrawal of water from nature Withdrawal of water from nature is the direct abstraction of ground water, surface water

or spring water and bank filtrate.

Waste

Construction and demolition waste More than 40 % of Construction and demolition wastes are dumped into former and

meanwhile inactive mining tunnels and about 30 % is reused for construction purposes.

Municipal wastes are wastes from households and similar wastes from commercial and Municipal waste

> industrial sources. Also separately collected fractions and packaging do belong to municipal waste. Municipal waste are further differentiated into "household waste" (food waste, bulky waste, etc.) and "other municipal wastes" (market waste, street

sweepings, etc.).

Other wastes

All remaining wastes which don not belong to one of the categories "municipal waste", "construction and demolition waste", "rubble-waste" and waste from waste treatment and summarized under the position "Other waste".

Waste from mining and treatment of mineral resources

This waste category contains waste types, which are generated during detection, exploitation, extraction and physical and/or chemical treatment of resources. Before all enterprises and productions units belonging to the sectors minig and waste disposal have to report on this topic.

Waste from waste treatment installations

Wastes generated during waste treatment and dedicated for additional waste treatment are named secondary wastes. They are belonging to the waste chapter 19. These secondary wastes are registered as input into waste treatment facilities and do belong to the waste balance. Waste amounts from waste treatment facilities which are neither subject to further treatment nor to disposal are assumed to go for recycling. Environmental protection measures

Current expenditure for environmental protection

Current expenditure for environmental protection includes compensation of employees, intermediate consumption, consumption of fixed capital as well as other taxes less subsidies on production as far as they are arise in the environmental areas of the protection of ambient air and climate, waste water management, protection of remediation of soil, groundwater and surface water, noise and vibration abatement, protection of biodiversity and landscapes, protection against radiation, environmental research and development or other environmental protection activities. Included are expenditure of corporations, general government and households. Up to now, expenditure of non-profit institutions serving households is not included.

Environmental taxes

Environmental taxes are taxes whose tax base is a physical unit (or a proxy of it) that has a proven specific negative impact on the environment. Four subsets of environmental taxes are distiguished: energy taxes, transport taxes, pollution tayes and resources taxes. In Germany the following taxes are included: energy tax, electricity tax, motor vehicle tax, nuclear fuel tax, air transport tax, revenues from ${\rm CO_2}$ emission permits.

Expenditure on environmental protection

Environmental expenditures are capital and current expenditures related to characteristic activities and facilities specified in classification of environmental protection activities. They include environmental expenditure for own purposes (ancillary activities) and for use by other economic units. Included are expenditure of corporations, general government and households. Up to now, expenditure of non-profit institutions serving households is not included.

Investment expenditure for environmental protection

Integrated or clean technologies are new or modified technical facilities designed so that environmental protection is an integral part of the production process. These technologies reduce or eliminate emissions and discharges or are less resource-intensive than the equivalent "normal" technology used by other producers. Examples are closed-loop circulation, fluidized-bed combustion, or heat exchangers.
