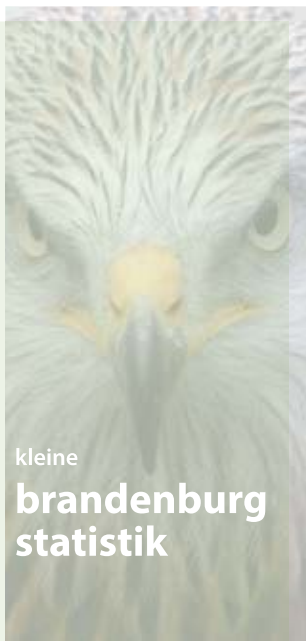

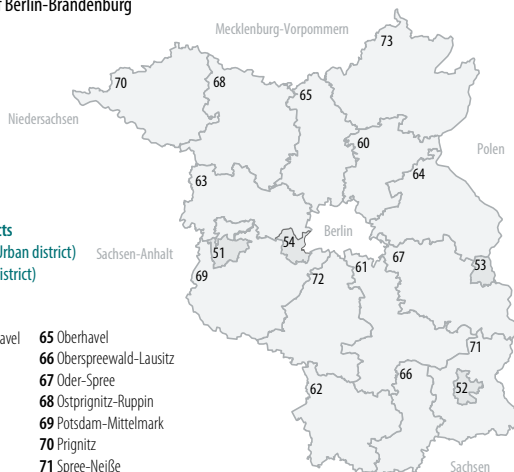

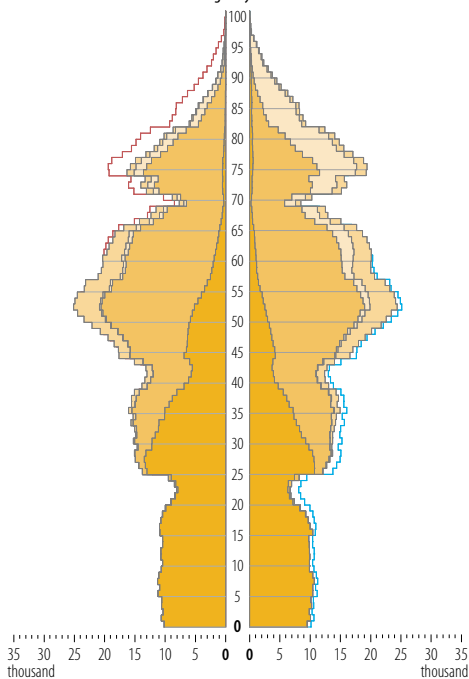

by age and marital status

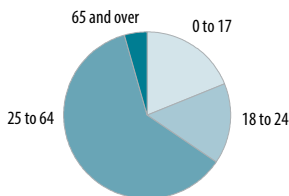

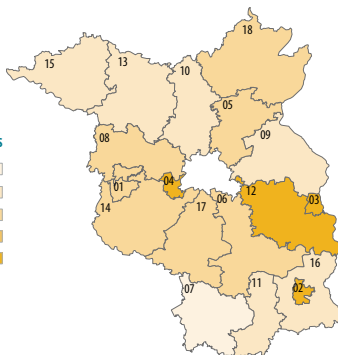
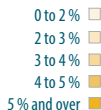

by age groups



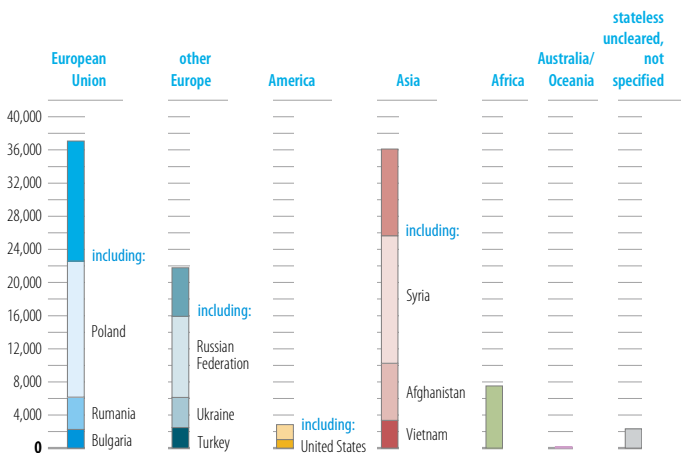

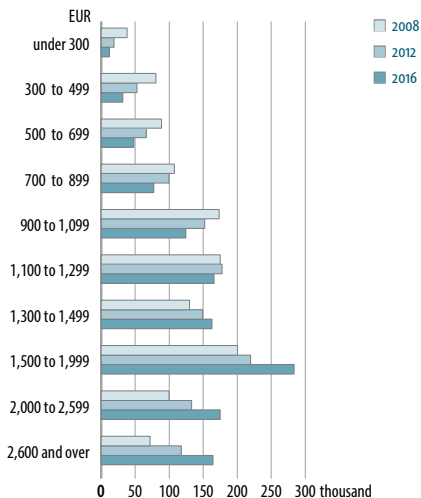
■ Employed persons ■ Unemployed persons ■ Inactive population

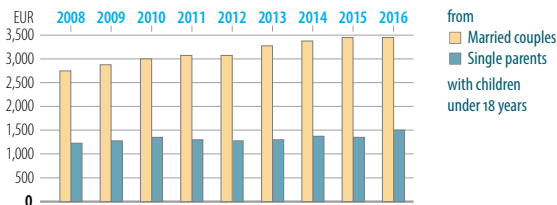

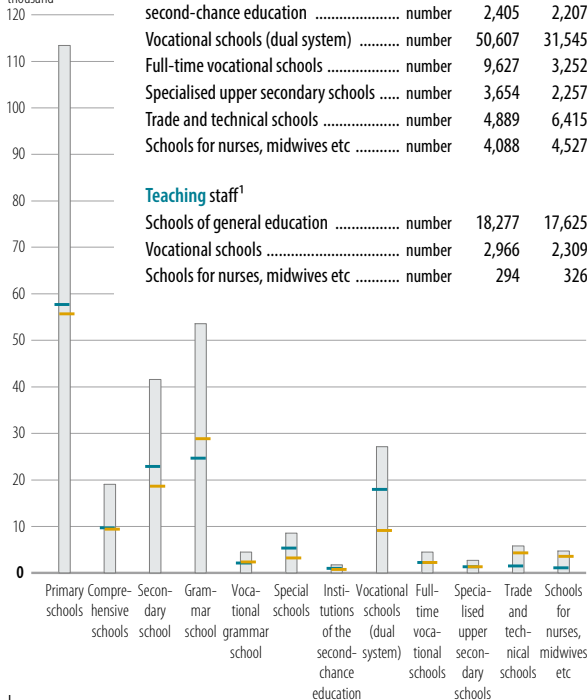
Average monthly net income of families

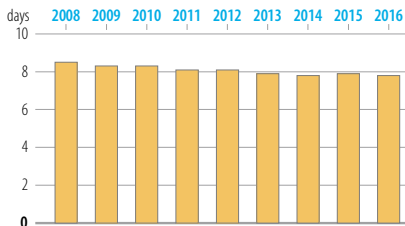

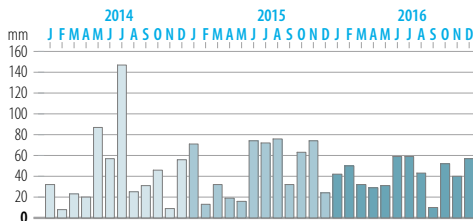

rate of change in percent

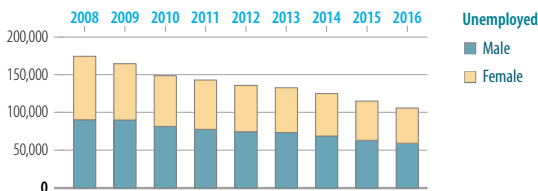

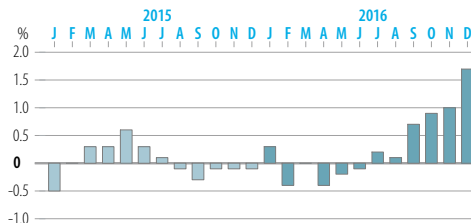

change on same month of previous year



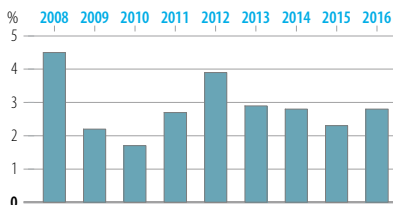

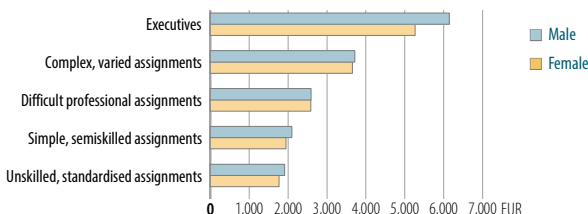

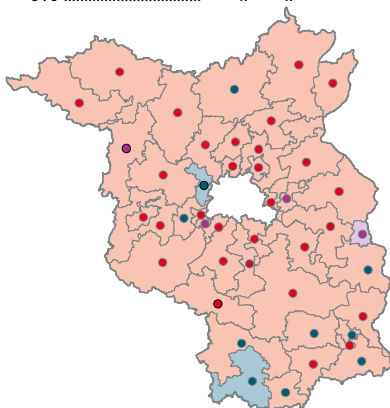
Mandates
